



Dear Employees, Clients, Partners, and Suppliers:

As many of you already know, The Ontario government, in response to COVID-19, recently introduced tighter restrictions, including a stop on nonessential construction in Ontario.

The province now says that only critical construction projects can continue, including industrial projects such as refineries and petrochemical plants, energy projects, and infrastructure projects such as new hospitals, roads and bridges. Some exceptions include "residential construction projects where a footing permit has been granted for single-family, semi-detached and townhomes, or an above-grade structural permit has been granted for condominiums, mixed-use and other buildings."

As a result of this, activity on many of our project sites has ceased until further notice, however we do have projects underway that fall under the above criteria.

We are still 100% remotely operational in terms of reviewing our clients challenging soil projects, preparing proposals, preparing shop drawings for future projects, and answering any questions our current or potential clients have.

The safety of our workers, our clients' and the public as a whole remains our top priority. While it's regrettable that many worksites have had to shut down, all of us at GeoSolv are in full support of the government's efforts to reduce the impact of COVID-19 on our province.

Health Canada recommends that you follow the below guidelines:

- Wash your hands often with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands
- Cough or sneeze into a tissue or your sleeve, not your hands
- Practise social distancing—maintain a 2m separation from others
- Any person experiencing cold or flu-like symptoms should not report to work and should notify their immediate supervisor by phone.

We will continue to monitor the situation closely and follow the advice of industry and government officials.
