



Dear Employees, Clients, Partners, and Suppliers:

Ontario has now entered Stage 2 of the reopening of the province. The continuation of “*All construction activities or projects and related services that support construction activities or projects, including demolition services resume and essential workplace limits lifted.*”

All of our projects deemed *Non-Essential* within Stage 1 have now fully resumed in Stage 2, and we continue to be 100% operational. Although the continuation and resumption of construction projects continue across Ontario, there are still a number of on/off-site business precautions that remain in place, and that GeoSolv continues to be committed to adhering to, as outlined by the government of Ontario. The Ontario governments recommendations include:

Coronaviruses are spread through close contact, including at work. Here are some helpful tips to help prevent the spread of germs:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water or alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Sneeze and cough into your sleeve.
- If you use a tissue, discard immediately and wash your hands afterward.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.
- Avoid contact with people who are sick.
- Stay home if you are sick.
- Avoid high-touch areas, where possible, or ensure you clean your hands after.
- Where possible, wear gloves when interacting with high-touch areas. Do not touch your face with gloved hands. Take care when removing gloves. Ensure you wash your hands after removing them.
- Wash your clothes as soon as you get home.
